Reading

Your children will have receive a new reading record and school reading book. The reading records are to help children develop a habit of reading. Any books that your child enjoys reading can be recorded in the reading record; it is not just for the levelled books from school. The levelled books from school are useful to track progress of children's reading fluency and comprehension, but I would prefer them to read books they are interested in and enjoy reading. We are aiming for each child to read at home with an adult at least four times each week - please record this in the reading record so that I can monitor reading progress throughout the year. Please ensure your child has a book and their reading record in school every day.

Homework

Termly Project: Each half term, your child will be given a research project to do based around their topic. More details about the first project regarding the Stone Age will follow next week.

Spellings: Weekly homework consists of 10 spellings to be learnt for a Friday application task. I will give these spellings out each Friday starting from next week for the check the following week.

Handwriting: Along with the 10 spellings, a handwriting sheet will be given each Friday also to be completed by the following Friday morning. The children have handwriting folders in school so please bring the sheet in once completed so we can keep them in their folders.

Snacks

Although we do not provide fruit in Key Stage 2, you are more than welcome to send in a healthy snack for your children to have at playtime. Please also send your child to school each day with a named water bottle.
