The Anglo-Saxons

Our learning journey this half-term takes us back to the Anglo-Saxon period of History.

Here are some ideas of what you could do. Be as creative as you like!

- Create a poster or a booklet to show what you have learned about the Anglo-Saxons. It should be neatly presented with joined up handwriting and sub-headings. Include a variety of information with pictures.
- Research Anglo-Saxon jewellery/ brooches. What were they made of? Who wore them? What were the patterns/ designs?
- Look at Anglo-Saxon settlements. What were the houses made of? Where did they settle and why? You could make an Anglo-Saxon house.
- Map work. Find out some Anglo-Saxon place names. Explain where it is and what the place name means. Draw a map of the UK and label them on.
- Weapons. The Anglo-Saxons were fierce warriors. Investigate weapons used. You could even make your own shield or helmet.
- Bake some bread using an Anglo-Saxon recipe. Write out the recipe using clear instructions.
- Write a fictional account of a day in the life of an Anglo-Saxon.
- Famous leaders. Research Alfred the Great. What was he famous for?
